



Scottish Widows Parish Walk 2010

Organised by Manx Harriers

An invitation to compete on June 26/27

The Parish Walk is one of the oldest sporting events on the Island's calendar. First held as a sporting challenge between two men in the last century, it was revived in its present form in the 1960's, as an event open to all.

What is it? It is a walking race that is open to competitors of all standards, and an event that generates a tremendous social atmosphere. To complete the course you have to walk 85 miles, calling in at each of the Island's 17 parish churches, but for most competitors it is a challenge to see just how many churches they can reach. 2009 saw an entry of 1620 and 185 actually finished the entire course. Two thirds of the entries reached Peel or further.

The start of the race will be on the track at the NSC, King George V Park, Douglas. Checking-in will be at the NSC at the King George V Park. The route description is in your race entry pack and please familiarise yourself and your support team with it. There are No Stopping Zones created along the early part of the course, where assistance to walkers is forbidden. This is to ensure a safe walk for everyone and to keep traffic flowing safely. Please ensure that your support team are aware of these rules, as failure to adhere to them will lead to disqualification.

There is an open race over the complete course, 85 miles. There will be additional prizes for ladies over this distance. Under 21 Ladies and Men race to Peel, 32.5 miles. There will be awards for best men/mixed team and best ladies team based on four walkers results. Please note the new regulations for teams in the rules. There will be awards for all those who complete the course within 24 hours and prizes for the top finishers in each category. The minimum age for all walkers is 18 on the day of the event.

Following on from 20 years of sponsorship from Clerical Medical we are delighted to welcome Scottish Widows as our headline sponsor in 2010. We hope that this new relationship will allow us to improve and expand the Parish Walk in the years to come.

Anyone who gets to Santon Church or beyond will receive a certificate to show the last church they reached and the time taken. Electronic timing will be used again this year courtesy of Manx Telecom and provided by SPORTident UK. Computerised results will be posted on the website www.parishwalk.com.

The entry fee is £25.00 and entries may be made on-line on our official website www.parishwalk.com. Follow the links to SPORTident UK and make your entry. The deadline for entries is 12 noon on Saturday May 15th 2010.

The enclosed entry pack includes several rules and regulations, to ensure that everybody can compete fairly and safely. Ticking your entry form indicates that you have read these and agree to abide by them. Please put your entry in as soon as possible to facilitate our overworked secretary. Due to very tight schedules in getting the programme printed and the event organised this closing date will be strictly adhered to and no late entries will be accepted.

An entry list will be posted regularly on the website. Please fill in your mobile number so that you avail of our texting service leading up to the race.

There is a 24 hour time limit to complete the course, with appropriate cut-off times along the way, based on a 3-5 mph schedule. This should not be a problem to most people, but we will have to adhere to these times. The cut off times for Santon is 3½ hours, Rushen 5¼ hours and Peel 9 Hours. The cut off times for the later churches will be printed in the race programme and on the website.

Further entry details, race information and results will be posted to the site. The prize presentation will be on Wednesday June 30th at 7.00 p.m. in The Villa Marina, Douglas. All competitors and supporters are welcome.

Please note that the race will start at **8.00 a.m. and from the NSC**. This is to ease the severe congestion caused by the walk in Douglas and on the early parts of the course.

Please make sure that you complete the forms correctly.
